ROCKIN' SEMINAR

Before the start of the MCAH Scholarship Golf Tournament, the MIH hosted a 1-1/2 hour seminar on ROCKS, June 24, 2014 at Pearl Country Club. The seminar focused on manufactured rocks, construction of rock walls and the engineering aspects of rocks. **Brian Joy**, President of Big Rock Industries, provided manufactured rock samples from the Aulani Hotel and Ulupalakua, Maui. **Karl Kamada**, Affiliated Construction, provided insights of the construction aspects of natural and manufactured rocks. The emphasis on writing current and appropriate specifications in the construction documents were highlighted with Karl giving examples of what to do and what not to do. Comments from the seminar attendees indicate that the specification writers need to scrutinize the appropriateness of how the specifications are written and not boilerplate old, antiquated specs. The technical aspects of rock construction were provided by **Ron Prescott**, President Tokunaga Masonry. MIH was able to host this "free admission" seminar because of the generous contributions from the previous MCAH Scholarship Golf Tournaments.
